

Charlie D. Strang Ultimate Service Award

The Charles D. Strang Ultimate Service Award, developed in 2010 is given to one individual who exemplifies the highest standards of devotion and accomplishment for the benefit of the APBA through unselfish service to APBA as has been uniquely set by Charles D Strang during his more than seven decades of continuous membership in our organization. This award will be presented annually by the President of APBA at the conclusion of the annual Honor Squadron Ceremony.

Any candidate for this honor must meet the following minimum requirements:

1. The candidate must be a current member of APBA and the Honor Squadron of the APBA, and must have met these requirements during the 9 years preceding the year of candidacy.
2. The candidate must have been active in unselfish beneficial service to APBA without deriving financial benefits related to these services, for the 10 years preceding his candidacy.

The recipient of the award will be selected by a committee chaired by the President of APBA and will be structured as described below.

- a) For the 2011 award only, the selection committee will consist of the President of APBA, the Senior Vice-President of APBA, Fred Miller and Edgar Rose.
- b) For the 2012 award only, the selection will consist of the President of APBA, the Senior Vice-President of APBA, the 2011 recipient of the award and Fred Miller.
- c) For the 2013 award only, the selection will consist of the President of APBA, the Senior Vice-President of APBA, the 2011 and 2012 recipients of the award and Fred Miller.
- d) For the 2014 award, and all subsequent awards, the selection committee will consist of the President of APBA, the Senior Vice-President of APBA, and the three most recent award recipients.

The selection of the honoree will take place in a telephone meeting arranged by the President at a time convenient for all Selection Committee Members. The chairman will have the same voting rights as all members of the committee and in the case of a tie, his vote will serve as the tie-breaker. The name of the honoree will not be made public until the award ceremony, i.e. the same policy as used for Honor Squadron honorees will be applied.

If any year no individual is selected for this honor, the award presentation for that year will be canceled and in its place the reason for the cancellation will be announced by the President of APBA immediately following the Honor Squadron Ceremony.

The Award is a gleaming Herring 5-blade propeller, mounted on a wooden plaque with the winner's name embossed in metal.

There will be a take home award provided for the first recipient and all recipients thereafter for a t least 10 years and will be entirely funded by Barbara Strang.
