2021 Return To Racing, Phase 3 Covid-19 Plan

Until the current State Phase 3 guidelines change, the following will apply to our 2021 events.

Each registered driver may bring up to 3 crew members to an event.

Spectators will not be allowed at 2021 Phase 3 events.

The March 2021 PHASE 3 section of the "HEALTHY WASHINTON Roadmap to Recovery" and "Spectator Events" guidelines limit participants to a maximum of 400. The document may be viewed at:

Registration

Preregistration will close 7 days prior to each event. Once the SOA & APBA steps are complete, a confirmation email will be sent to you. Participants that arrive at the event without being preregistered <u>may</u> not be allowed to enter and participate.

Please Use The Following 3 steps To Register

- 1) Use the link on the SOA webpage to notify the race committee of your intent to participate and who you anticipate will be your crew members (maximum of 3).
- 2) Use the link on the SOA webpage to access the APBA registration for each specific event. This will be where you tell us the classes you will race. It is preferred that you upload your APBA card, and Club Membership Card by following the directions within this page.
- 3) The chief scorer for each event will return an email to the driver with acknowledgement and confirmation of classes entered as well as the entry fee amount. The driver will then be given an option for prepayment. To limit contact at the event, prepayment is highly recommended.

Trailer Move In and Race Days

- Read all of the bullet points on the sanction for each race to know where the required check in location will be prior to Pit entry with the COVID-19 Team Manager (CTM). This volunteer is assigned by the race director, and is included in the race committee.
- All SOA BOD members are part of the COVID-19 Team and will be trained and have documentation to refer to regarding the policy that SOA will be following at the time of each event.
- Both the pre-registered driver and their crew member(s) will be required to complete and pass the COVID-19 Health Screening <u>EACH DAY UPON ENTRANCE</u> of the pits is allowed and/or participation in any sanctioned days activities. Participants will have the correct color wristband on and visible.
- Participants will remain in their immediate pit area until the current days wrist band has been issued.
- Participants are requested not to hold gatherings, and will adhere to the Washington State social distancing guidelines of the recommended 6 foot spacing as much as possible.
- A Drivers only meeting will be conducted each day utilizing a voice amplification system as needed to accommodate social distancing.
- Driver (and parent of minors) will report to registration ONLY upon request (this will be announced in pits).
- Rule of the day: All participants (including officials) will be required to wear a face covering at all times. The exceptions will be wearing a helmet, and while working in your immediate pit area with your team.
- Drivers and Crew will have disinfectant or hand sanitizer available at each race trailer

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
